
Masao Moves 15' 15'

She is not even safe in her own bedroom for the bullying, she received messages like: “you are worthless” and “go to hell filthy bitch”. In this movie we go on an online journey, together with Rosalie, to find the help she needs. Would the internet be able to change from being her worst enemy to a friend?



Just Kids: Girl on a Mission

Miruna doesn't want to get married young and have a lot of children like other girls in her neighborhood. Her dream is completely different: she wants to become a police officer! Needless to say, Miruna has to study hard to realize her dream. But how is that possible when she also has to take care of her twelve younger brothers and sisters?



Just Kids: Harbour Boys

Max, Emre, Jash, David and Hilson. Five friends from school, all born in the Netherlands, but each with different origins; Turkish, Surinamese, Syrian, Chinese and Dutch. For the close-knit group of friends, these differences do not matter, their daily environment is the same. They live at Heijlmaat, a working-class district hidden in the immense port area of Rotterdam, literally between the sea containers and the huge ships. Here they spend all their free time.



Just Kids: If You Leave Me

When the parents of Jamilla (14) could no longer take care of her, she was placed out of her beloved house. Now she has been living for several years in a foster home. She misses her parents, and because of the problems she has had, she finds it difficult to show her true self to others. Instead, she builds a wall around her but this is definitely not working for her in a positive manner. Her mission is to break down the wall she built and open up. The big question is: does she have enough courage to do so?



Just Kids: Lara's Journey

Getting lost in your own street and being unable to find your way home again. That happened to Lara (14). She has autism and things that are easy for other children are very complicated for Lara. That's why she doesn't do many things independently. In the past she didn't mind, but now that she is getting older, she is disappointed in herself. She just wants to do the same things children of her age do. Like doing things on your own. Lara wants nothing more than to overcome her fears and asks her friends; how do I tackle this new situation?



Just Kids: The Moonsoonshow

Kunal (14) is completely blind. In his opinion, it is not a problem because he is bursting with talent. His grandmother is convinced as well; he can for example name all capitals in the world and blow away everyone with his raspy singing voice. Kunal lives together with nuns at a boarding school in India. The Monshoonshow is coming up, a singing competition where mainly seeing children compete against each other. Kunal is clever enough to ask his classmate Neeraja to sing a duet with him. Why? She happens to have the loveliest voice in the world.



Just Kids: Outside-in

The parents of Emma just got divorced and she is doing everything possible to please them. But all the arguments and changes make her restless. At the same time, she has to train for the national championship shooting, where she hopes to win the competition. But Emma finds it difficult to concentrate, while she is still getting used to living between two homes. When her father turns up with a new girlfriend, she tries her best to keep up with all the changes. Unfortunately this relationship ends and Emma is fed up and decides it is time to think about herself.



Just Kids: Gracious

Gracious is deaf and communicates through sign language, but in all other ways she's just like any other teenager. The open expression on her face speaks volumes in this intimate portrait. At school, she makes a drawing of her future home. "Now put some people in it," encourages the teacher. Gracious draws only herself. She becomes increasingly withdrawn at school. Something terrible happened last year, and she's still very angry. In sign language she explains on camera that when she was staying at her grandmother's house, her cousin raped her.



Just Kids: Under My Skin

Tracy (16), who lives in Uganda, carries a big secret. On the outside, you can't see it, but she is infected with the HIV virus, which she got from her mother at birth. Every day, Tracy takes medication to prevent her from becoming seriously ill and getting AIDS. Because Tracy's parents died from the virus, she lives with her grandmother. In her village, no one knows she is HIV positive. She doesn't even dare to tell her best friend, with whom she shares everything else.



New Just Kids: Bee child

Everyday the Ugandan Siriël goes to the bee field with his mom to take care of the bees. He and his sixteen foster siblings can't live without the income of honey. He dreams to go to school to become a priest. Sadly last year the bees did not give enough honey and now his mother can't pay the school money. He is a little bit afraid of the bees because they can sting. So there is only one solution, Siriël needs to overcome his fear and take good care of the bees. Bee child is about the right of education for every child.



New Just Kids: My letter to the oilmen

The Nigerian Papilou (14) lives on the edge of a heavily polluted piece of land in the Niger Delta. In the backyard of his father, thousands of liters of crude oil ended up in the river due to a leak in an oil pipe. All crops failed.
